



Guide on how to use the rubric

Harry Walker's rubric

The rubric that you have in your hands was created by Harry Walker in order to evaluate apps. His rubric is the most reliable around the world and the one most tested in various countries and various situations. We decided to use his rubric as all the web pages we have searched, refer to this one. It's also free under CC licence.

In an article that he wrote he states that the best apps he ever encountered scored maximum 24. If you check the rubric, there are 7 domains to check in every app, with scores 1-4, with 4 being the highest. If an app scores 20 and over, it means it's a high quality app.

So the way to use this rubric is the following:

- For every app that you find, you need to fill a separate rubric. Write the title, the subject of the curriculum, the age that the app is suitable for and a short description.
- 2. If the app scores 20 and over, it means it's an app to share.
- 3. Send the rubric of the app to the email of the project (educationtransmedia@gmail.com)
- 4. Remember that we agreed on five (5) apps for each subject that we chose, in our own language or in English and all the apps have to be free of charge.
- 5. If you have suggestions to change anything about the rubric, you have 5 days to do it.
